Use of Copyright Materials at School

Statutory Defences and Exceptions to Infringement – Fair Dealing

- The Copyright Act permits the limited and fair copying and communications of works and other subject matter.
- No permission is required or payment made to the copyright owner if the use is one of fair dealing for the purpose of:
 - ∅ Research of study
 - ∅ Criticism or review
 - ∅ Reporting the news

Use of Copyright Materials at School

Print Licence Limits

Literary, dramatic and musical works can copy:

- Reasonable portion = 10% or 1 chapter

BUT can copy

- Whole of the work
 - Where work is not separately published or if it is separately published is not commercially available within a reasonable time
 - One article or part of an article is an issue of a journal, magazine or newspaper or more if the articles are on the same subject
- Can copy Artistic work that illustrates text reproduced within the licence limits and in other circumstances the whole of the work
- Can copy the whole or part of a literary or dramatic work in a published anthology of work if that work comprises not more than 15 pages of that anthology
