## ("Daily Events" – as per the first school magazine)

- 27<sup>th</sup> January, 1959. school commenced at the Exhibition Hall.
- 30<sup>th</sup> January: first hobby period. The following groups were founded: Chess Club, Choir, Musical Appreciation, Stamp Collecting, Model Air Craft and Drama.
- 2<sup>rd</sup> February: Church Service held at West End Methodist Church to mark beginning of academic year.
- 10<sup>th</sup> February: First Crusader meeting held by Mrs. Benton
- 4<sup>th</sup> March. first inter-school vigoro and softball matches played against. Townsville High School.
- 7<sup>th</sup> March first inter-school cricket match against Townsville High
- 31<sup>st</sup> March for the first time all students wore the correct uniform.
- 1<sup>st</sup> April: inter-house Swimming Carnival was held.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> April: inter-school Swimming Carnivals were held, the girls in the afternoon and the boys at night. This was also the day on which Mrs. Hollis, the commercial teacher left.
- 6<sup>th</sup> April: we moved into the manual training wing of the new school. Miss
  Gibson joined the staff as the commercial teacher.
- 9<sup>th</sup> April: first Student Councillors' Meeting held at the new school.
- 20<sup>th</sup> April: first term examination began
- 23<sup>rd</sup> April: official enrolment of cadets
- 24<sup>th</sup> April: the school attended an ANZAC Day Service at which the address was delivered by Mr. Holliday.
- 11<sup>th</sup> June: Mr. Pizzey, the Minister for Education, visited us to inspect the unfinished building and address the school. He was accompanied by Mr. Whitmee, Mr. Aitkens and Mr. Snell.

- 18<sup>th</sup> June: Russell Carvol th and Charles Koch competed in a public speaking contest, "Youth Speaks for Australia".
- 1<sup>st</sup> July: on his return trip to Brisbane, Mr. Black, the Director of Secondary Education, visited us and addressed us on the highlights of his visit to Mt. Isa and Mary Kathleen.
- 4<sup>th</sup> July: members of the Charters Towers High School played basketball and football against Pimlico.

- 27<sup>th</sup> August the cadets attended a sports day and rifle shoot at Garbutt
- 9<sup>th</sup> September: Dr. Val Vallis, a well-known Australian poet, spoke to us about Australian poetry. Mr. Goon Chew addressed us on Gundoo Week and national fitness. At the same time the Industrial students were inspected by Mr. McCracken, the Inspector of Manual Training.
- 15<sup>th</sup> September: A.T.C. cadets marched through the streets of Townsville as a part of Air Force Week celebrations.
- 16<sup>th</sup> September: inter-house Athletics Carnival was held at Corcoran Park and Blue House was victorious
- 25<sup>th</sup> September: boys' inter-school Athletics were held at the Sports Reserve.
- 29<sup>th</sup> September: the school was inspected by Mr. Roberts, the Inspector of Secondary Schools.
