The Program of Excellence in Global Studies is aimed at academically high-performing students and/or students with an interest in community service, leadership and global affairs. The program provides opportunities for academic extension and enrichment while developing the skills and attributes required to be engaged, competitive and successful citizens and leaders in our complex and rapidly changing world.

Effective global citizens of the future will require a complex set of skills and attributes in order to be successful, flexible, reflective and resilient learners in a fast-paced, globally-connected and knowledge-driven economy. These same skills and attributes will also prepare our future leaders to make a positive difference in a world that holds both exciting opportunities and complex challenges.

Global citizens are creative and critical thinkers and problem solvers. They are capable of combining ideas from across traditional discipline areas to create new solutions that solve real world problems and exploit emerging opportunities. They care about others and have a sense of responsibility to contribute meaningfully and ethically to making our world a better place.

Across Years 7 to 10, the Program of Excellence in Global Studies is anchored in students' Social Science studies. Students in the program will also be grouped together across their core classes of English, Mathematics, Science and Health and Physical Education in order to provide structured and targeted opportunities for interdisciplinary learning and academic extension.

Embedded within students' studies will be opportunities to engage in transdisciplinary studies and projects that connect and extend their learning across subject areas. Over the course of their studies, students will engage in real-life, transdisciplinary projects, research and investigations linked to a range of external partners, including James Cook University, Decarbonize and the Young Persons' Plan for the Planet Program. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in related extra-curricular programs such as Model United Nations (MUN) and Pimlico Think Tank across Years 7 to 12. In Year 11, all students have the opportunity to develop their skills of global competence through Pimlico's innovative Certificate II in Leadership
